Washington County Sheriff's Department and other local law enforcement agencies have a busy weekend planned.


Saturday morning, emergency services workers and many additional volunteers will take part in the annual Shop With a Cop.

The Town Council also approved giving the Pierce-Polk Volunteer Fire Department an additional \$1,500 from the contract line item. The contract with the town and the department will be ready to sign at the council's December meeting, which will be Dec. 16 at 6 p.m.

Outside of those items, and the approval of the 2026 salary ordinance, the council just received information from Town Manager Jaden Stone.

Management Plan is complete and the town continues to send out ordinance violations.

Pekin man killed in Thanksgiving morning shooting

Thursday, November 27, 2025: Indiana State Police detectives are investigating a shooting that occurred in the early morning hours of Thanksgiving, resulting in the death of 26-year-old Juan Antonio Gutierrez of Pekin.

Thursday Around 1:30 morning, the Washington County Sheriff's Department responded to a shooting on the 9000 block of Bush Road near Pekin, Indiana. When officers arrived, they found Juan Gutierrez had been shot with Officers and emergency personnel immediately began lifesaving measures and Gutierrez was transported by ambulance to Ascension St. Vincent Hospital in Salem. Tragically, however, Gutierrez succumbed to his injuries and was pronounced dead at the hospital.

Indiana State Police detectives and a crime scene investigator Reckless Homicide, a Level were requested and responded 5 investigation, detectives obtained



a handgun and was unresponsive. a search warrant and collected physical evidence at the scene. Investigators also conducted interviews with those at the residence, including Philip James Hawkins.






